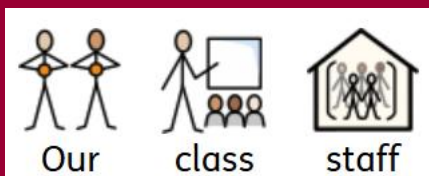




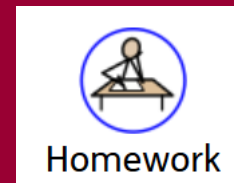

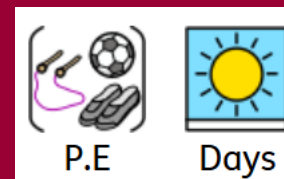


We will be reading The Great Fire of London by Emma Adams and James Weston-Lewis

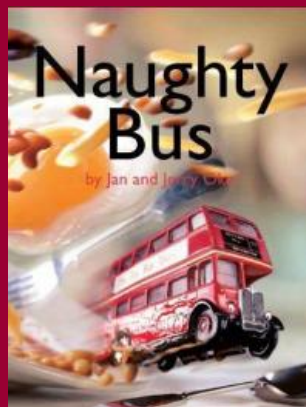
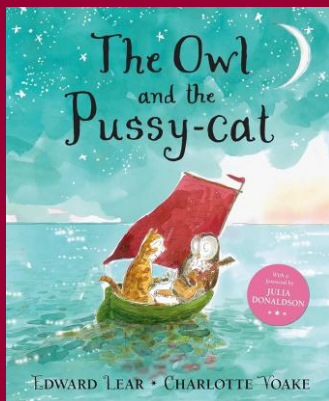
English

Next half term we will be reading *The Owl and the Pussy cat* and *Naughty bus*.

The children will write their own sequels to stories, diaries and non-chronological reports.

They will look at joining words to make longer sentences and expanded noun phrases to add detail to their writing.

The children will also continue to practise their punctuation skills with using full stops, question marks and exclamation marks correctly.



Maths



We will be learning to recognise fractions, including recognising, finding, naming and writing one-quarter, one-third, one-half/two-quarters, and three-quarters of an object, shape or quantity. Followed by sequencing and comparing time, events in chronological order using language [e.g. before and after, next, first, today, yesterday, tomorrow, morning, afternoon and evening]. Units of time, recognise and use language relating to dates, including days of the week, weeks, months and years and know the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day. Then learn to tell the time to the hour and half past the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.
